THE ASSP (ASSE) TIME CAPSULE


[Continued from Page 1] The package was transported to a nearby office where it was treated with the reverence of a time capsule-from a bygone era. The first outer layer was removed revealing:






However, nothing was more adorable than these safety posters created by kids in a national contest for cash prizes-some of them are quite good-enjoy and thank you Bob for sharing!!.
