



### SAFETY MINUTE

#### CAMPUS SAFETY - THERE'S AN APP FOR THAT

Eighteen to nineteen million students are currently enrolled in colleges and universities around the US¹. These institutions help shape the future and provide vital education resources to the communities in which they operate. When choosing a higher learning provider students consider their major, location, and the cost of attendance. However, one item may come to mind a little less often, safety. Campus safety is an essential part of the experience and something that may linger in the mind of every parent sending their child off to a brighter future. A search of "safe college campuses" or "safest college in the US" will turn up a variety of results. Most colleges will proudly display safety awards and credentials on their webpages to help inform of their current safety programs.

Emerging in the campus safety world are safety applications. As students will most likely have a smartphone on them at all times, it brings these resources straight to their pocket. Liberty University has launched an application called Champion Safe. We recently had the honor of seeing a tour of the application and received these details from the campus:

#### "Champion Safe: Enhancing Campus Safety at Liberty University

The **Champion Safe app** is a critical tool in Liberty University's commitment to campus safety, offering a wide range of features designed to provide students, faculty, and staff with real-time safety resources at their fingertips. The app includes essential tools such as **Mobile Blue Light**, which allows users to send their real-time location to LU security while instantly connecting with an emergency dispatcher. Additionally, the **Virtual Walkhome** and **Friend Walk** features give users peace of mind by allowing them to be monitored by either campus security or a trusted friend during their walk across campus.

Champion Safe also provides direct access to **Safe Ride**, a secure transportation service available when students feel unsafe walking, and **Social Escape**, a discreet tool that generates a fake call to help individuals exit uncomfortable social situations. Users can also report safety concerns through **anonymous tip reporting** and access **emergency plans**, **campus maps**, **and support resources** all within the app. By integrating these features, Champion Safe has significantly improved campus safety, offering proactive solutions that empower the Liberty University community to stay aware, connected, and secure."
